What Do You Expect?

A few years ago, on a Friday in January during the busiest time of the morning, a young man came into Washington, D.C.'s L'Enfant Plaza, just outside the Metro. He was wearing jeans, a T-shirt and a ball cap. He was carrying a violin. He took it out of the case and placed the case on the floor in front of him and tossed in a few dollars. He then turned to face the people who were rushing past and began playing the violin.

The young man played for 43 minutes and during that time 1097 people walked past him. A total of seven people stopped and listened for more than a minute. Twenty-seven people tossed money into the case. But most people paid absolutely no attention to the music or this young man.

What the people rushing by that morning did not realize was that they could have enjoyed a free concert by the internationally

acclaimed violinist Joshua Bell as he played some of the most stunning music ever written – on a multi-million dollar 1713 Stradivarius violin.

During the three-quarters of an hour Joshua had \$32.17 tossed into his case in appreciation for his talent. In more typical settings his playing can bring in up to \$1,000 a minute. It was part of an experiment by the *Washington Post* to see if people would stop to notice beauty amid the bustle of rush hour? Joshua commented afterwards that it was such a strange feeling to be ignored... as if he did not even exist.

People walked past Joshua Bell because he was not presented in the way they expected. They might have noticed if he was wearing a tux at the Royal Albert Hall or Carnegie Hall, but he did not fit their expectations and so they missed him.

Jesus did not fit the expectations of his day. Born in a

stable, no home, no wealth – just a carpenter from Nazareth. Some missed him because he did not fit their picture of the Messiah.

Some thoughts: Beware of your expectations and how you think God will look and act and appear in your life. You don't want to miss him because he does not fit your picture. Beware of how busy you are with things in life. You don't want to walk right past the beauty and glory just because you were in a hurry. Know that God is bigger, and brighter, and more glorious than anything you can imagine, but you will find him even in the little things of every day life... when you least expect. We are constantly asking the question "Where have you seen God?" We ask that as an encouragement to all of us to keep our eyes open and to be aware that the Lord is always around us and He is always doing amazing things. Look around! Don't miss God's glory!
